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DO I NEED TO NOTIFY MY STUDENTS THAT I'M PARTICIPATING IN A STRIKE?

No, you are not required to notify your students, either. Many teaching staff, however, choose to tell their students in advance about the industrial action and why they're taking it (see useful text, below). We encourage all staff to talk with students about our campaign.

DO I NEED TO NOTIFY MY MANAGER THAT I'M PARTICIPATING IN A STRIKE?

No, you are not required to notify your manager beforehand that you are taking protected industrial action. You are welcome to do so at your discretion. However, you must notify strike action in Workday.

I'M SUFFERING FINANCIAL HARDSHIP BECAUSE OF MY PARTICIPATION IN PROTECTED INDUSTRIAL ACTION - HOW DO I GET HELP?

The NTEU maintains a Defence Fund for members who experience financial hardship because of their participation in protected industrial action. There are conditions for accessing this support, and these recognise, in particular, the situation of casual and low-paid staff. For assistance, please get in touch: uq@nteu.org.au



HOW DO I NOTIFY MY STRIKE ACTION IN WORKDAY?

After you have undertaken the strike action, log into Workday. Go to 'Absences', then select 'Request Absence'. From the list of types of leave, choose 'Unpaid and Leave without pay', which will open up further options, and choose 'Absent to undertake strike action'.

This will then take you to a new screen, in which you can 'Edit quantity per day', and there you can put in the number of hours you were on strike.

I'M A CASUAL MEMBER OF STAFF, HOW CAN I PARTICIPATE?

Casual staff often find it difficult to take industrial action because of their more limited work hours and income. If you are a casual worker intending to take strike action, follow the same instructions as for continuing/fixed term employees (above). Before the strike, notify your supervisor and students to the extent that you feel appropriate. After strike day, notify that you have taken industrial action in Workday (as above).
